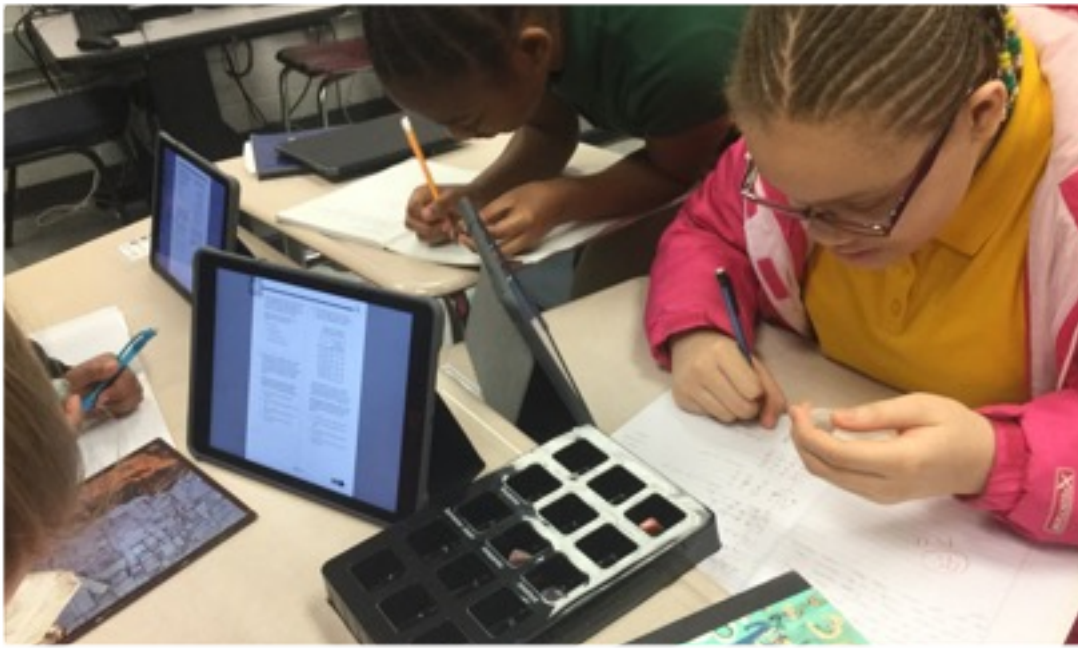

The Mississippi Science Test will be held in May for 5th grade.

The Mississippi Science Test is an assessment taken in grades 5 and 8 to gauge what students have mastered within the science framework.

The MST2 is made up of multiple-choice test questions ranging from easy to difficult. Mississippi teachers were involved with the creation of the items on the assessments.

Students in the fifth grade at Sherard Elementary work daily using the Science Fusion curriculum and hands-on activities to prepare for the state test. This also gives them the opportunity to experience science in a “real-world” way.

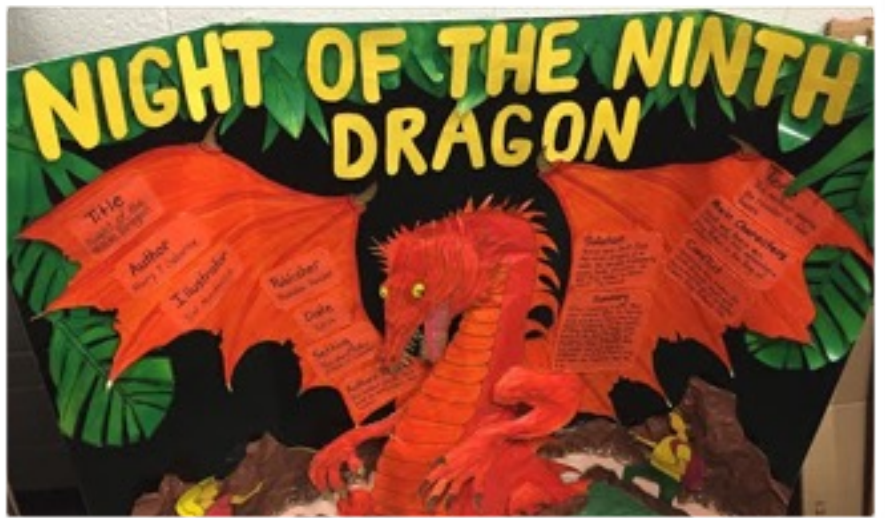

Each year, the Office of Elementary Education and Reading hosts the Mississippi Reading Fair Competition. Students in Pre-K through twelfth grade design boards to showcase their favorite book.

“A successful fair is one in which students enjoy the process of reading, creating a project, and sharing their favorite book, whether individually, with peers or with family members,” said Tenette Smith, Director of the Office of Elementary Education and Reading.



Students at Sherard were able to submit boards as individuals, in groups or as a family. Boards were mandatory for third through sixth graders.

“Reading Fair boards allow students to be creative and show what they really loved about the book they read,” said Kerri Peden, 5th Grade ELA.





MAP Tests

The Mississippi Assessment Program (MAP) is designed to measure student achievement on the Mississippi College-and Career-Readiness Standards for reading and math. These tests are used to determine areas of strengths and weakness for individual schools, teachers and students.

Students will be taking their third nine weeks test on March 6 - 10 using Mastery Connect. These tests are great tools for preparation for the MAP assessment.

The state will administer the MAP assessment sometime within the testing window of April 17 and May 19.

"We are working hard every day to prepare for state testing," said Jonnetta Robinson, 6th Grade Math. "Our students will do great!"

There are five areas of reading instruction: Phonemic Awareness (Hearing Sounds); Phonics (Decoding Words), Fluency, Expanding Vocabulary and Comprehension.

Help us expand your child's vocabulary:

1. **Read to your child each day.** When the book contains an interesting word, pause and define it.
2. **Study word parts.** If your child knows the meaning of a root word ("kind"), then he'll know what the new word means when the prefix ("un"/not) or suffix ("ness"/state of being) is added. (unkind, kindness).
